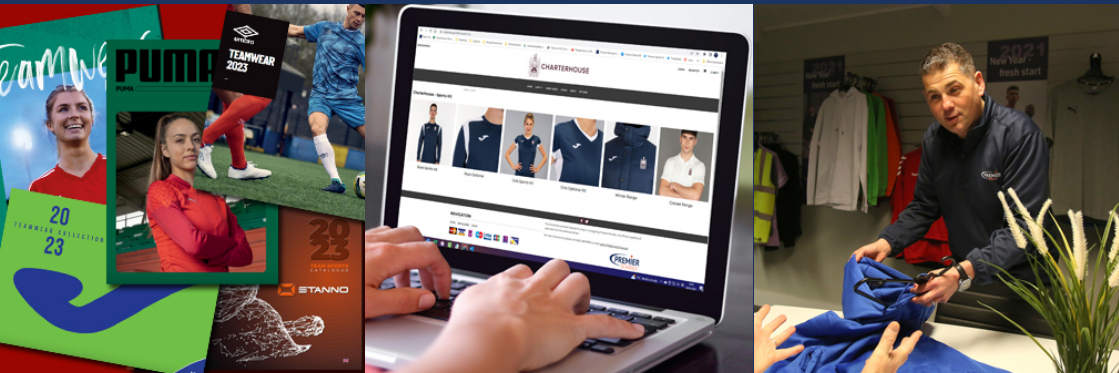

Editorial



Good Morning and welcome back to The Bill Kyte Stadium for this Premier Sports Southern Combination League Division One match. We welcome the players, officials and supporters of Alfold FC and welcome to today's match officials.

Hope you had a good day yesterday with loved ones, with this being our last home game of the year, on behalf of the players, managers and committee, we would like to wish you all a Happy New Year.

On Tuesday 5th December, G's travelled to Worthing United for a midweek game on the coast. This game saw the return of young Liam Avery who was with us last season and re-joined us from Sheerwater. G's started off the better of the two sides and had the chances to go ahead. Unfortunately G's went 1-0 down on 40 minutes when G's keeper Ryan seemed to miskick and put the ball into his own net. Chances came and went for Godalming in the 2nd half and with each breakdown Worthing countered trying to exploit the spaces at the back as we pushed forward. A safety first corner conceded and some slack marking from it presented Worthing with a 2nd goal on 70 minutes, 2-0 full time.

A few days later on Saturday 9th December, G's entertained Forest Row. With many games being called off because of the weather, the pitch passed an early inspection and it was game on. Well done to Pete Ballam and the volunteers for getting the pitch playable. There were a few new names in the line-up as G's injury list greatens. It only took about 10 minutes of play for the visitors to get on the score sheet when they went long, with a ball out of defence, to a player wide on their left to put Forest Row 1 up. Towards the end of the half the Gs were mounting a bit more pressure. Gs had a good chance for a Jimmy Norman screamer from 30 yards out, which Jimmy hit well enough, but the visiting keeper hung on to it well. G's were a bit livelier in the 2nd half and were now dominating play, but not getting too many clear shots on target. A great build up by the Gs before the ball came out to Liam Avery but he lifted the shot over the bar. On 87 minutes the game was sealed as the Gs all went up for a corner to try to grab the equaliser, only to see the visitors break quickly out of defence down their right before crossing in to make it 2-0 after the Gs had absolutely dominated the second half territorially. With two defeats in a row, G's made the trip to 2nd place Roffey on Saturday 16th December. Roffey made the better start with an early shot that just went wide. On 30 minutes, G's new signing Joe Condon glanced a long ball through to Josh Toya-Nero, Roffey keeper came out and handled outside the box. The Referee consulted the linesman, and the decision was a red card; one of them obviously felt it denied a goal scoring opportunity. Jimmy Norman then stepped up to take the free-kick and fired it into the goal where the Roffey defender took over the gloves. 1-0 to the G's. Roffey found themselves down to 9 men after a Roffey striker was sinbinned. G's created chances before the break but couldn't convert. On 57 minutes, Roffey equalised with a soft goal as G's could not take advantage of the extra man. But On 70 minutes Ollie McAleese played a long ball forward to Josh in the box who was brought down in the box. Penalty to the Gees with Jimmy Norman restoring our lead at 2-1. More Roffey players were sinbinned and their manager sent off as well but G's protected the lead and saw out 11 minutes of added

time to secure a great three points.

Today we welcome Alfold FC to the Bill Kyte Stadium. Alfold came down from the premier division after being relegated last season. They are sitting lower mid-table in 12th place and have won 3 and lost 3 of their last six league games and go into today's game on the back of two wins. Joe Hasler is their leading scorer with 7 goals this season with Noel Fisher just behind with 5 goals. Keiron Joesph scored 2 goals in their 2-0 win against Oakwood last Saturday (16th December).

The U23's have started to pick up their form when they travelled to 2nd placed Tooting & Mitcham U23 on their 3G pitch on Monday 11th December. They made the better start in the first half and on 15 minutes Edward Goyea put the G's 1-0 up. They held on to the lead to half-time. On 65 minutes Finn Jordan put the G's 2-0 up. It was a nervy last 20 minutes but G's held on for a great 3 points. Last Saturday (16th December) they entertained Yateley United U23s. G's made the perfect start and went 1-0 up on 11 minutes when Vinnie Martin got his 1st of the game. 20 minutes later Yateley went down to 10 minutes and G's had a penalty, Vinnie stepped up and got his 2nd goal. Yateley pulled a goal back in the 2nd half but G's secured another win on 80 minutes when Vinnie got his hat-trick. This put them up to 5th in the league as they go into the Christmas break.

G's U13 are currently sitting in 7th in the league which is still good for our young lads in a tough league. They travelled to Binfield U13 Celts back on the 25th November and lost this game 4-2. They then entertained Binfield U13 Chargers on a rare game under the lights on Weds 13th December. This was a tight encounter between the two sides and it was the visitors that went away with the points with a 5-4 win. On Saturday 16th December they travelled to Hawley Youth Raiders hoping to finish for Christmas with a win and that they did as they thrashed their opponents 8-3.

The U14s are still 2nd in the league only 3 points behind the league leaders Bisham FC U14 Reds but G's have two games in hand over the league leaders. Their game against Wokingham and Embrook was postponed on the 9th December. Their last game of 2023 was when they entertained Soccerkids FC U14 on Saturday 16th December. It was a comfortable 4-0 win for the G's and continue their unbeaten run into the new year.

Fixture News:

The first team re-arranged fixture with Seaford Town will be played on Saturday 13th January 2024. The first team are still in the Surrey FA Premier Cup and got a bye to the 2nd round. They will host Ash United at home. Date to be confirmed in January.

I am pleased to say that the floodlights are back working featuring a new temporary tower at the road end replacing the damaged one. The lights have now been certified for another two years which means that first team and U23 home games can now kick off at 3pm and we can host midweek matches again. We will still ask teams if they are happy to kick off 2pm some Saturdays to help save money but this has to be in agreement with both parties.

Alfold FC Club History

The club was established in 1920 as Loxwood and Alfold and joined the Rudgwick & District League. The club split in 1928 and Alfold joined the Cranleigh & District league, before becoming members of the Horsham & District League. They won the league title, the League Cup and the District Cup in 1953-54. When the league folded in the late 1960s, the club transferred to the West Sussex League. They won the Tony Kopp Cup in 1970-71 and were Division Two North champions 1980-81 and 1993-94, also winning the Surrey County Lower Junior Cup in 1988. The club won the Premier Division title in 2002-03 and the Chichester Charity Cup in 2010-11. Alfold were Division Two runners-up in 2012-13, earning promotion to Division One. In 2015 they moved up to Division Two of the Southern Combination. A fourth-place finish in 2017-18 was enough to earn promotion to Division One. The following season saw the club win the Division One title, resulting in promotion to the Premier Division.

GODALMING TOWN

HISTORY

The club has its origins as Godalming United FC, formed in 1950 by ex-pupils of Godalming Grammar School. Between 1950-71 the club played at the Recreation Ground. However, in 1970 Surrey Senior League side Farncombe collapsed, leaving their ground in Meadow vacant. Godalming took over the debts and tenancy, changing their name to Godalming and Farncombe FC, and the ground to Wey Court in the process.

The original pitch was where the nearby Wey Court Sheltered Housing stood and considerable amount of work was undertaken on the new playing area, which was built on the site of an old waste tip. The club was helped by Waverley Council when drainage problems and subsidence meant they had to find a temporary home at Broadwater Park.

The club was accepted into the Combined Counties League for the start of the 1978 season, and a year later the name was changed again, to Godalming Town FC.

In 1985, another local club, Addlestone & Weybridge, was disbanded and, before their ground at Liberty Lane was demolished, Godalming purchased the stand and perimeter fence for £225 and £50 respectively. The stand was re-erected at Wey Court, with seating and fascia added.

The next development came in 1992 when the Guildford Football Appeal (formed in an attempt to return the towns name to senior football, following the collapse of Guildford City in 1977) donated a sum of money towards floodlights, and in return the name of the club was changed again to Godalming & Guildford FC.

Further recycling followed in 1995, when a new turnstile building was erected incorporating a turnstile from Millwall's old ground and in 1996 the clubhouse was refurbished.

During 2005 close season, the club changed its name for a fifth time, albeit back to one of its previous incarnations, that of Godalming Town. A fantastic 2005/06 season saw the side take the Combined Counties League Championship and

League Cup by storm. Godalming Town were then accepted by Isthmian League officials following extensive ground improvements.

At the end of a tough season, Godalming found themselves at the bottom of a very competitive division. However, events elsewhere meant that Godalming were reprieved from relegation and were transferred into the Southern League's South & West Division for the 2007/08 season. Chuck Martini replaced Roger Steer as Manager in October 2007. Town were moved back to the Ryman League for the 2008/09 season and eventually finished in another record high position, 9th. Godalming also progressed further than ever before in the FA Cup by reaching the 3rd Qualifying Round before losing 2-1 at Conference South side Havant & Waterlooville.

The 2009/10 season was arguably the best season in the history of the club. Town finished a record high position 4th in the Ryman South but were eventually beaten 2-1 in the Playoff Final at Folkestone Invicta. The club progressed further than ever before in the FA Trophy and won the Surrey Senior Cup by beating Sutton United 2-1. The season also saw local boy Shaun Elliott become the club's record appearance holder after reaching 360 games in a Godalming shirt. Chuck Martini was replaced by joint-managers Jon Underwood & Neil Baker in October 2010 and the club finished an unpredictable season in mid-table. The 2011/12 season saw a lot of new faces join, but the team quickly gelled, reaching the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, beating Wimborne, Moneyfields, Worcester City & Bodmin before bowing out to Maidenhead United in front of 700 at Wey Court. The G's finished 5th in the league, and travelled to Bognor Regis Town in the playoff semi-final, drawing 4-4 after extra time but Godalming lost 5-3 on penalties.

2012/13 saw Jon Underwood and Neil Baker guide Godalming to their highest ever finish in the pyramid, finishing in 3rd place. The G's lost in the playoff semi-final for the second year running, this time losing 2-1 to Biggleswade at Wey Court. The season finished on a high however, as Godalming lifted the Surrey Senior Cup for the second time

in four years, beating Sutton United 1-0 at Gander Green Lane, thanks to a last minute goal from Scott Harris. The close season saw Godalming moved to a third different league in as many years, this time to the South & West Division. With divisional change came a managerial change; Jon Underwood and Neil Baker left Godalming to join Slough Town, taking the majority of the squad with them. Andy Hunt was appointed manager in June 2013, assisted by Neil Selby.

The 2013/14 season was probably one of the hardest the club has dealt with. Andy Hunt was given the task of putting together a squad that will compete in the league and secure step four football. At Christmas 2013 the clubhouse, kitchen and changing rooms were ruined by flood water. Godalming finished the season in 18th position. Godalming were then moved into another division again and played in the Southern League Central Division for the 2014/15 season.

Godalming finished in 10th position in the 2015/2016 and reached the Surrey Senior Cup Final for the 3rd time but lost 4-0 to Merstham.

The 2016/17 season could be viewed as an annus horribilis for the men as wins became less frequent than management changes. Andy Hunt left and was replaced by Dean Thomas who subsequently departed before the club was relegated under Dan Turkington. Inevitably relegation followed and Dan departed, as did pretty much the entire first team.

On the upside the Ladies team under the auspices of Steve Davies and Darren Wheeler finished second in Division 2 South and were promoted to division one in the Greater London Women's Football League.

2017/18 began in familiar fashion with a new management team and a new squad in a new division. After a promising start under Simon Funnell and Matt Drew (including a brief run in the FA Cup which finally ended at Hereford), wins became harder to come by and by Christmas Jon Palmer and Gavin Smith were in charge. After a slow start, a promising run took the Gees out of the relegation zone before fixture congestion and high turnover of players led to a second relegation in two years.

The under 18s had a great season and finished 2nd in the U18 Premier Elite whilst the Ladies first team continued to go from strength to strength with an exciting FA Cup run and promotion to the GLWFL Premiership. The development squad finished an excellent third in division 3.

On a sad note February 2018 saw the passing of Bill Kyte the Godalming Town president of an

astonishing 57 years. It is true to say that without his tireless work; the club would not even exist today which is why it is fitting that the name of the ground was changed to The Bill Kyte Stadium in memory of the great man.

After another poor season for the men's first team, inevitably there had to be changes and in June 2018, Les Cleevely was appointed first team manager, following a long and illustrious playing career and managerial roles at Carshalton and Walton and Hersham amongst others, and as goalkeeping coach at Spurs and Chelsea.

Under his leadership, the vessel steadied with Godalming finishing a creditable 12th in Division One of the Combined Counties in the 18/19 campaign.

2019/20 ended prematurely but not before another year of turmoil that saw the departure of Les Cleevely and also his replacement, Paul Bonner. The final games of the season were overseen by Phil Ruggles and his team before COVID 19 shut us down.

The 2020/21 season saw Phil expand his coaching staff and assemble a competitive squad that promised a far more relaxing season for Godalming supporters before it's cancellation in December.

Football restarted with a small round robin competition and finished on a high with victory in the Cherry Red Challenge Cup final in May.






















After a slightly bumpy start in more ways than one the Gs became a very hard team to beat and finished 7th, rueing a few limp draws in the early part of the season, which otherwise would have seen us comfortably in the play-off places. This was a big step forward for a club more used to looking down the table rather than up. More importantly in the last two and a half years Phil and his coaching team built a squad that has dug in through thick and thin and who are only getting stronger as a unit. 22/23 was our best season in years. We won a cup, lost a cup and were mugged by Wick in the promotion play-off semi.

So, 2023/4, once again it's refreshing to see many of the same faces return after the summer break, we say a very fond farewell to Phil Ruggles and wait with baited breath for the new season under our old friend Tony Roberts. Onwards and upwards. New arrivals have strengthened the squad and we're looking forward to whatever the new season throws at the us.

Another very frustrating day for the Gs squad and their supporters. It was a day when, to be honest, I half expected the game to be called off, due to the heavy rain that preceded the game. So, it would be a slippery, slidey sort of game. But what surprised me, more than that the game was on, was the number of Gs players missing from the team sheet. We have been without stalwarts like Ross Cheek and Rikki Letch for a few games now, but to see that Rob Parrott, Luca Scannella, Ben Matthews, Jason Cotton, as well as Matt Cox (who came off injured during the week at Worthing) were also not present, was a bit a shock.

So, it seems that Ben Matthews was at Wey Court, but was far from well, so Tobias Simms was drafted in to the defence from the U23s for the starting line-up along with Will Ab-Lorwerth, while Ollie McAleese, Jack Sherwood and Jimmy Norman completed what looked like a back five to me. A new face to me in Ellis Rowland was in the midfield along with Liam Avery. James Mariner, was in his usual position in front of the back line, while Cameron Edwin and Jason Vincent were up front. Ryan O'Sullivan was wearing the keepers jersey although Ollie Ballam was also on the bench with Ben Beazley who looked useful in his previous outings, along with Tom White, George Broad and Josh Toya-Nero.

I suppose that with many changes it was always likely to be a bit messy at times and it seemed that way in the first half.

It only took about 10 minutes of play for the visitors to get on the score sheet when they went long, with a ball out of defence, to a player wide on their left who looked very close to offside to me, but the lino was not in agreement. So, one up to Forest Row.

The Gs did see plenty of the ball and Cameron Edwin battled away again anywhere on the pitch and managed to get into shooting positions on two or three occasions, but the final shot, although on target, was not quite what he was hoping for and was well covered by the Forest Row keeper.

Jack Sherwood looked most dangerous when he came in at pace from the right wing, which he did a couple of times. On one, after some nifty exchanges with Cam, in front of the Main Stand as they worked their way forward, it ended with Cameron being taken down as he shaped up for a shot and appeals for a penalty that were not heeded by the referee.

The Gs had a good chance for a Norman screamer from 30 yards out, which Jimmy hit well enough, but the visiting keeper hung on to it well.

Towards the end of the half the Gs were mounting a bit more pressure.

Cam hit a shot just over the bar and then, shortly after, tried a cheeky lob that almost worked, while the keeper was off his line, but it went just wide.

Will got in on the act and had a good shot from range, which the Forest Row keeper had to gather at the second attempt.

Then just before the break a deflected shot from the visitors saw Ryan have to get down to his right, smartly to cover it.

The second half saw the Gs be a bit livelier to me. Jack making a couple more attacks down the right, going past defenders, but either the shot was covered or went narrowly wide.

Then after a ball in from Jack Sherwood, Jason Vincent appeared to be taken down by the visiting keeper next to his near post and both players received attention on the pitch amid shouts from the Gs again for a penalty. Which, again the referee in discussion with his linesman dismissed. Shortly after Jason was replaced by Josh for his first appearance for the senior squad I think.

Ben Beazley came on to replace Will Ab-Lorwerth. Also, Tom White came on at the expense of Mazza as the Gs went all out to get an equaliser. The Gs were now dominating play, but not getting too many clear shots on target.

A great build up by the Gs before the ball came out to Liam but he lifted the shot over the bar.

Cam came in from a narrow angle under the attention of a defender, but his shot went just wide of the upright.

Yellow card for the Forest Row number 15. In range for Jimmy. This time the keeper got down well and pushed the ball out, as it was curling in low to his left.

George Broad came on to replace Cameron who had again worked his socks off without getting the reward he deserved.

Then after another attack the Gs saw Liam get another chance at a volley, dropping just in below the crossbar but again the Forest Row keeper managed just about to scramble the ball away.

Minutes later, Tom White finally for the Gs, fired the ball in from about 8 yards out, only for the ref to point out that there had been a push on a defender in the build-up, to the goal, so ruled it out.

Then the game was sealed as the Gs all went up for a corner to try to grab the equaliser, only to see the visitors break quickly out of defence down their right before crossing in to make the game safe at 2 - 0 after the Gs had absolutely dominated the second half territorially.

With so many players already injured it was not good to see Jason Vincent with the help of Tom White limping down the steps to the changing room.

Miraculously, the Gs still remain in third place in the League, but have played more games than any other team and those below are also closing in with games in hand.

If we are to have a realistic chance of promotion, we need to get back to winning ways a.s.a.p.

Off to Roffey next Saturday. So, need to be at our very best.

The 3rd corner was won by Jason Vincent who went on his own although probably Tom White was better positioned. Matt played in Liam on 12 minutes, but Rob Parrott was unable to direct his header on goal. Tom shot wide from 35 yards taking a free kick after he had been fouled. Good play between Cameron, Jason, Rob and Matt ended with another cross going across the box. Cam attempted to play in Matt but as his pass cannoned off Jason Vincent Matt was flagged offside. Tom was unlucky as the spin from a long ball from Ryan O'Sullivan took the ball into the arms of the Worthing keeper.

A controversial incident on 35 minutes, Luca's free kick found Matt on the right who appeared to be brought down. No free kick and he required a lengthy period of treatment both on the pitch and the sidelines before rejoining the game. Worthing woke up and won 2 corners just after which came the 'goal' when, with the ball in our goalmouth and no opposition in sight, Ryan appeared to miskick the ball into his own net. 1-0. Yellow shirted heads visibly dropped, they had been on top up to that point and the only meaningful action of the few remaining minutes saw a let off as a home player broke through on goal only to blast the ball over the bar with the keeper the last man.

As you were for the 2nd half and Luca created an early chance for Tom who shot wide. After a very few minutes it was apparent that Matt Cox was unable to continue due that earlier injury. A great shame, he had had a good game down the right flank, we wish him a swift return. Ben Beazley came on to replace him. Chances came and went for Godalming and with each breakdown Worthing countered trying to exploit the spaces at the back as we pushed forward. Best to gloss over a 'training routine' free kick between Tom, Luca and Rob which led to another home attack. Rob saw a shot scrambled away by their keeper, on another day it would have been in. 62 minutes and Jimmy Norman replaced Mazza, the armband passing to Luca. A safety first corner conceded and some slack marking from it presented Worthing with a 2nd goal on 70 minutes.

Luca was involved in two more chances, turning and shooting just wide from the edge of the area and then seeing a long range effort deflected for a corner. Jimmy Norman thought he'd won a corner to see it overturned by the Linesman for an offside. Cam who again was working hard on the right let his frustrations turn into a yellow card, joining Luca who had been booked earlier. 10 minutes remaining and the final substitution saw Will Ab-lorwerth replace Tom White, Luca moving further forward and straightaway latching on to a header that went wide. Final minutes and it was Rob Parrott's turn to let off steam, the linesman being instrumental in seeing him sin binned. Final whistle 2-0.

All desperately frustrating, I don't know what more to say. We have been sat in 3rd place in the table for weeks now without consolidating that position and the closing pack is doing just that, closing in, and each of them with games in hand.

We go again with Forest Row at home on Saturday, 2pm kick off.

Joe Condon was fouled and from Jimmy Norman's free kick we had a decent shout for a handball missed by the Referee. Rob Parrott picked up on a poor Roffey goal kick and played in Josh who couldn't get enough power on his shot. Ryan O'Sullivan punched out a Roffey free kick, danger cleared by Jimmy Norman, Rob picked up the ball on the right and crossed but a bad bounce in front of Josh stopped him hitting goalwards. Josh was out of luck again shortly after as he could only turn a Jack Sherwood cross into the side netting.

Almost on the half hour Joe Condon glanced a long ball through to Josh, the keeper came out and handled outside the box. The Referee consulted the linesman, and the decision was a red card; one of them obviously felt it denied a goal scoring opportunity. Cue unhappiness in the crowd and the home bench and the Roffey No. 3 going in goal. His first job was to pick Jimmy's free kick out of the net, 1-0 Gees. No time to restart before we saw a sinbanning for Roffey's No.10. To be fair the stand-in keeper's second job was pulling off a good save from a shot by Josh. Ellis Rowland was showing some lively touches and combined with Liam Avery to see Josh win another Godalming corner. It was much as you were for the restart with two decent chances for Joe and Josh before the Roffey No. 2 saw the sinbin. Then typical Gees, against 9 men and we conceded what looked a soft goal on the near post after a break down our right and it's 1-1. Joe Condon forced their keeper into another save and Will Ab-lorwerth came on for Jack after sinbanning 2 was over. 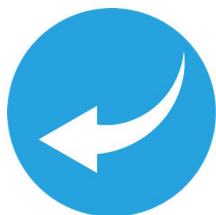
